



**Terms and Conditions to apply for ICSSR Sponsored

1. The ICSSR Sponsored 10 Days Research Methodology Programme in Social Sciences will be organized at Centre for Research in Rural and Industrial Development (CRRID), Sector 19-A, Madhya Marg, Chandigarh on June 10-19, 2019.
2. Candidates enrolled for M.Phil/Ph.D./PDF in a UGC recognized institution in any of the following social science disciplines are eligible to apply for the course.
 - (i) Sociology and Social Anthropology;
 - (ii) Political Science / Public Administration;
 - (iii) Economics;
 - (iv) International Studies;
 - (v) Social Geography and Population Studies;
 - (vi) Commerce and Management;
 - (vii) Social Psychology;
 - (viii) Education;
 - (ix) Social Linguistics / Socio-Cultural Studies;
 - (x) Law / International Law;
 - (xi) National Security & Strategic Studies; and
 - (xii) Other allied Social Science disciplines (Library Science, Social Work, Media Studies, Modern Social History, Health Studies, Gender Studies, Environmental Studies, Diaspora Studies, Area Studies, Sanskrit-Society & Culture etc.) to promote interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary research.
3. About thirty (30) candidates- 10 local, 10 from within and 10 from outside the state- will be selected for the course.
4. Decision of the CRRID on selection of candidates for the course will be final.
5. Travel to outstation participants will be paid as per the ICSSR rules for the programme.

8. The selected candidates will be informed by email only, by May 20, 2019.
